REMINDING OURSELVES ADAPTATION STRATEGIES

 <u>Ostrich</u> - Dead end – no support for adaptation efforts in Czechia– denial of climate change - "reference for "no-action" scenario – Zdeněk Žalud + Petr Štěpánek + Petr Dobrovolný

2. <u>Go with the flow</u> – reactive adaptation in Czech agriculture (and landscape) in line with the current adaptation strategy - attempts to maintain profit margins and accepting losses in terms of non-marketable ecosystem services - no anticipation of climate change impacts and adaptation around the World – **Emil Cienciala + Otmar Urban**

3. <u>Hold the ground</u> – some proactive efforts in Czech agriculture (and landscape) in line with the current adaptation strategy BUT focused at at least maintaining the current level of ecosystem services and maximizing comparative advantages offered by climate change; The goal is not to lose under the future climate especially not lose the productive ecosystem services; We accept the World around us is changing and adapting creating opportunities for "us" but also for "them". – Petr Hlavinka + Christian Kersebaum + Josef Eitzinger + Jan Esper

4. <u>Make the best of climate change</u>— proactive efforts focused at maximising the overall level of ecosystem services, Accepting inevitable losses to any of the service including marketable ones but actively working on offsetting them by gains in other services; primarily working with existing technologies; We accept the World around us is changing and adapting creating opportunities for "us" but also for "them".

Joergen Olesen + Paula Harrison + Reihart Ceulemans+ Wolfgang Wagner 5. <u>Outside the limits</u> – strategy not bound by constraints or immediate costs - special focus on out-of-the-ordinary measures that if planned and applied could in the long-run massively increase landscape resilience.
